

Be it resolved that the DFL party...

Energy

41. supports transitioning to 100% equitable and clean energy economy in a way that reduces racial, gender, and economic disparities and that meets or exceeds net zero emissions by 2050. (35)
42. supports a moratorium on any new fossil fuel power generation capacity whose economic life extends beyond 2030, including any new or replacement crude oil pipelines in Minnesota, such as Enbridge's proposed line 3. (14)
43. supports ensuring a racially and economically just transition where all Minnesotans have access to the benefits clean energy brings. (6)
44. supports developing and implementing plans to move Minnesota beyond fossil fuels and dirty coal to clean energy by securing at least 50% of Minnesota's electricity from renewable sources by 2030 and increasing energy efficiency. (3)
45. will not support ethanol as a fuel in other biofuels and will work to transition Minnesota away from biofuels, with the exception of biofuels in aeronautics and those that cannot adequately be replaced with electricity.
46. supports the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividends Act, which would put a tax on carbon-emitting fuels and deliver all revenues to households as a monthly dividend. (2)
47. urges the state legislature to support the community-based development of Minnesota's renewable energy resources for rural economic development.
48. supports research funding, market development, and incentivization of new and promising technologies to facilitate the energy transition including but not limited to long-term and short-term energy storage, commercial, industrial, and residential electrification, and negative emissions technologies (for example, direct air CO2 capture).
