### **Natural Resources & the Environment**

82. supports a “prove it first” moratorium on all copper-sulfide mining projects until unbiased scientific review proves that this type of mining can be done safely in a water-rich environment like northeastern Minnesota. (10)
83. supports a ban of sulfide-ore copper mining in all federal and state lands in the Rainy River Headwaters in order to protect the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and Voyageurs National Park from being permanently contaminated by proposed sulfide-ore copper mining in the Superior National Forest. (7)
84. works to repeal the pesticide preemption statute preventing Minnesota cities from making decisions about the use of pesticides that harm pollinators.
85. supports the protection of native pollinators, such as the Minnesota state bee, the rusty patched bumblebee, through the conservation of existing host habitat and the creation of additional suitable habitat in order for all pollinator species to thrive.
86. supports banning single-use plastics.
87. opposes wildlife killing contests conducted in Minnesota and supports changes to Minnesota statute or regulations to ban any and all future killing contests that target unprotected mammal species.

### **Public Safety & Crime Prevention**

88. supports common-sense gun violence prevention measures to keep guns out of the hands of people who have proven themselves to be dangerous or irresponsible, including criminal background checks on all gun sales, extreme risk protection orders (often referred to as red flag laws), liability insurance for concealed carry permit holders, and safety training certification (5).
89. supports steps to reduce incarceration and its negative impacts through investment in alternatives to incarceration, reform of sentencing, probation, and supervised release policies, and reining in the excessive power of prosecutors; supports prosecuting white-collar crimes; and opposes for-profit incarceration facilities from operating policing facilities in Minnesota. (3)
90. supports passing legislation requiring registration and quantity limits for every bullet sold.
91. supports outlawing the possession, purchase, and use of assault-style weapons.
92. supports allotting funding and resources toward sexual violence and domestic violence advocacy programs statewide to promote a living wage for advocates, sustainable programming, and accessibility to advocacy services for victims and survivors, particularly those who are currently and were formerly incarcerated, in the LGBTQ+ community, and of all documentation statuses.
93. supports jail diversion projects, adequate access to mental health care in jails and prisons, and funding for community competency restoration projects.
94. supports providing full protection to current and past whistleblowers, and extended whistleblower protection to government contractors, scientists, and the financial industry, including pardoning Chelsea Manning and Edward Snowden of any crimes they have been accused or convicted of.
95. supports current and future efforts to empower community organizations to report incidents of hate and supports fully funding mandatory training curricula for law enforcement, in order to better respond to incidents and improve data collection.
